NAPLAN

Well done to all the students in Years 3, 5, 7 who participated in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. There was a high level of application demonstrated by all students throughout the testing period. We look forward to obtaining results later in the year and subsequently using them as one of many diagnostic tools to inform our teaching and learning at Bute Primary School.

Parent Workshops

I wanted to personally promote an upcoming parent workshop presented by the NYP Partnership of Schools. This workshop is being presented at a number of school sites, including Bute Primary School (With a crèche available at the Rural Care centre if bookings show demand). 

