
During term 4 in the case of catastrophic fire danger, the school will be closed and the school bus will not operate.

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From the Principal's Desk


End-of-term

The committee also made an executive decision to not include the Year spans as part of the name (eg. Reception – Year 7). In 2022, South Australian year 7 public school students will be taught in high school. Subsequently, a name with Year spans would become obsolete in the near future.


From the Principal's Desk

Collectively the students have read over 50,000 words and taken 40 more guizzes over the last 2 weeks. Even more exciting is the fact that our students have not only been increasing their reading stamina – they are actually improving their reading skills. The average Lexile level and Lexile Growth have both improved during this time. Well done to all students involved in this program and for continuing to challenge themselves to improve their reading.

NAPLAN Reports

Last week NAPLAN reports were distributed to those families who had children sit the tests in Term 2.

In Term 4, teachers and staff will be undertaking a deep analysis of student results and will use this information, in conjunction with other sets of data/information, to develop teaching and learning experiences which build on from students' demonstrated understanding and skills.


