

National Tree Planting Day

On Wednesday, 24th of July our young people participated in the National Tree Planting Day for schools. We took the opportunity to plant some native Eucalyptus trees in our developing Nature Play / Loose Parts area. The students did a fantastic job planting the trees and it was wonderful to observe the older students supporting the younger students, including the Preschool and Rural Care children. When fully grown, these trees will provide some screening of the materials from the community, as well as make great structures for cubby houses. There are numerous benefits associated with planting trees, however, I thought I would share some of the more interesting benefits;

- It has been shown that spending time among trees and green spaces reduces the amount of stress and fatigue that we carry around with us in our daily lives.
- Hospital patients have been shown to recover from surgery more quickly when their hospital room offered a view of trees.
- Children have been shown to retain more of the information taught in schools if they spend some of their time outdoors in green spaces.
- Green spaces can also help lower the level of crime within urban environments!

Mobile Junk and Nature Playground Visit

The Mobile Junk and Nature Playground visit would probably be my favourite highlight for the year so far. The day presented the students with such rich, authentic learning experiences which was further enhanced by the involvement of Snowtown Primary School and Preschool. The 'Junkman', Glenn, brought many interesting materials for the students to engage with, whilst providing some gentle guidance about what students could build, do and discover. The day was the perfect Segway into the reopening of our own Nature Play area which has been a popular area since Glenn's visit. The day also provided the opportunity for Snowtown students to get to know our students and our school. The Early Years team took the opportunity to showcase the wonderful Preschool, whilst the Middle/Upper Primary team took Snowtown students on a tour around the neighbouring streets to show off their Stobey Pole artwork. The town walk then concluded with a visit to the Bute Fauna Park. Thank you to everyone for playing their part in so many ways - supervising the children, encouraging the children, joining in with the children, cleaning children, comforting children, helping with the BBQ, taking photos, building networks with Snowtown staff, etc. the list truly does go on. A special mention to Andrew Pridham for cooking the BBQ for over 100 people! It was a wonderful day and we are looking forward to catching up with our Snowtown peers for a Science Show at their school in Term 4!





Measurement Masters

In Maths with Miss Dempsey this term we have been learning to measure objects and distances using standard measurement. We have been learning to use measuring tapes exploring centimetres and metres. We have also been exploring non-standard measurement using unifix connecting blocks.



We started by measuring objects in the classroom, then moved onto larger objects outside. We then created our own paper aeroplanes and measured the distances that we threw them. We had to record our results using centimetres and metres.

Bute Rural Care and Primary School students were enthusiastic, dedicated and excited about this program. Each day the Junior Primary, Middle and Upper Primary students added stickers to the posters that were provided and counted how many stickers were left until that poster was full. When one was finished they wanted to know what the next one would be and how many more they could complete. Mrs McDonald put the call out to schools in SA to send us any spare posters and we ended up with 14 (each poster had around 280 stickers) When the posters were finished a regular group of students started on the sticker sheets spending a few minutes each morning, recess and lunch filling up the sheets till we had exhausted our sticker supplies.

We have been very generously supported in the 2019 Woolworths Earn and Learn program.

Collectively we have attained **14,500 sticker** points. An amazing effort by our families, staff and school rural care community.

The SRC and rural care are now selecting educational resources for the students to use.
