

At Bute Early Learning & Primary School period products for students are available free of charge, in an emergency or to reduce the barriers which some students experience to their learning.



# Japanese with Minori



Minori Sensei helped the students make decorations for "tanabata", also known as the Star Festival. It is celebrated every year on July 7.

The festival traces its origins to a legend that the Cowherd Star (Altair) and Weaver Star (Vega) fell in love but were separated by the Milky Way. They are allowed to meet just once a year, on the seventh day of the seventh month. When this time of year comes around, Japanese people write down their wishes and hang them on bamboo trees, along with decorations.




