

From the Principal's Desk


Welcome Back – Term 3




Science Week 2022

National Science Week is Australia's annual celebration of science and technology during the week of 13 - 21 August (Week 4). Over the last few years we have worked hard to make Science Week a memorable event at Bute, and this year will be no different! The staff have been busily organising

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year in August. The NCCD is a collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'additional support' due to disability and the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students. More detailed fact sheets have been included with the newsletter for reference, however, there is no action required by families.

Mid-year intake to Preschool and School

The South Australian Government is introducing a mid-year intake into preschool and school.

1. What is mid-year intake?

A mid-year intake will allow parents to enrol students born in the middle of the year in preschool and school at a time that is more appropriate to their age and their stage of development.

The commitment for a mid-year intake in preschool gives families earlier access to high quality educational programs for their child.

2. When will mid-year intake commence in preschools?

The mid-year intakes will begin for preschool from 2023 and for Reception from 2024.

This means for 2023, children who turn 4 years of age:

- **Before 1 May** continue to start preschool at the beginning of the year.
- **From 1 May to 31 October** start preschool, day 1, term 3 of the year.
- **After 31 October** start preschool at the beginning of the following year.

3. When will mid-year intake commence in schools?

The mid-year intake for students starting school commences in 2024.

4. How many terms of preschool will each child have?

All preschool children will continue to receive 600 hours of preschool across 4 terms, regardless of whether they start at the beginning of the year, or through the mid-year intake.

For example:

- Children starting preschool at the beginning of 2023 - undertake term 1 to 4, 2023.
- Children starting preschool in term 3, 2023 - undertake term 3, 4 2023 and term 1, 2 2024.

5. How many terms of Reception will each child have?

Students who start school at the beginning of the year will continue to progress through 4 terms of Reception.

Students who start school through a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of Reception. For example:

- Children starting school at the beginning of 2024 - undertake Reception term 1 to 4, 2024. Beginning year 1, 2025.
- Children starting school in term 3, 2024 - undertake Reception term 3 & 4, 2024 and Reception term 1-4, 2025. These students begin year 1 in 2026.

6. How will children with additional needs be supported?

For children with additional needs, preschools and families should discuss and agree the preschool and school starting time that best suits the child's needs.

7. When can families register their interest in the preschool mid-year intake for 2023?

Families will be invited to submit a registration of interest form for the preschool mid-year intake in the same way they register for preschool currently. This means they can use the department's existing preschool registration of interest form. Further information about the timing will be available soon. Any forms submitted early should be accepted.

8. Where can families get more information?

The department's website has key information for families [starting preschool](#) and [starting school](#). These pages will be continually updated as we roll out the mid-year intakes and more information becomes available.

9. Who is leading this work?

A Mid-Year Intake Implementation Team is being established in the Department for Education. The team will lead all aspects of planning and implementation of the mid-year intake for preschools and schools.

10. What about the commitment to preschool for three-year olds?

Preschool for three-year olds is separate to mid-year intake and is part of The Best Start for Every Child Royal Commission.



Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
