


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From the Principal's Desk






Mother's Day

Primary student use of mobile phones and personal devices at Bute Early Learning and Primary School

With the widespread and increasing ownership of mobile phones and other devices among students it is critical that schools, in partnership with families, provide clear guidance for students to become informed, safe, respectful, and responsible digital citizens.

It is the Department for Education's position that access to personal devices during school hours must be managed so that students can be fully present in their learning and in their interactions with their teachers and peers. Included with this newsletter is our updated

"Primary student use of mobile phones and personal devices at Bute Early Learning and Primary School" policy which reflects the position held by the Department for Education. Please ensure you read through the policy and help your child(ren) abide by it's content.

The aim of this policy is to help promote:

- safe environments with reduced negative impacts of inappropriate use of devices at school, such as cyberbullying, exposure to harmful content, and critical incidents that involve mobile phones
- classroom environments where teachers can teach, and students can learn, free from distractions caused by personal use of devices
- use of breaks as quality time away from screens, encouraging physical activity and play and meaningful face-to-face connections with peers.

Wellbeing and Engagement Collection survey

Dear Parent/Guardian

Re: Wellbeing and Engagement Collection survey (Years 4-6)

Our students have been invited to take part in the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection survey. The survey will be open in weeks 2 to 5 of term 2 (Monday 8 May to Friday 2 June 2023).

Purpose of the survey

Young people's wellbeing is an important part of how they learn at school. The survey seeks students' views about their wellbeing and their engagement with school. Students in years 4 to 12 across the state will be invited to participate and the information collected will help the education system and broader community to support young people's health and wellbeing.

What is the survey about?

The survey asks students about their social and emotional wellbeing, school relationships, engagement and learning in school, physical health and wellbeing and after school activities.

How will students complete the survey?

Teachers will arrange for students to do the survey during class time. They will be asked if they would like to participate and are free to withdraw at any time. If you do not want your child to participate, please contact the school as soon as possible after receiving this letter.

Will students' information be kept confidential?

Students' personal information and identity will remain anonymous. Survey responses are confidential and no one (including school staff) can use the results to identify individual students. Participating schools with fewer than 5 students undertaking the survey will not receive a report of results, to protect the confidentiality of students.

What will happen if a student is distressed during or after the survey?

The survey includes some questions on topics such as student happiness and oullying.

Teachers will inform students that:

- . if they find the survey uncomfortable or distressing, they should leave the survey immediately
- . It is not compulsory to take part in the survey as a whole
- students can skip individual survey questions if they wish.

Students who would like to speak to an adult about any concerns they may have will be supported to do so.



Japanese Origami


Children's Day Origami Samurai Helmet

During Japanese this term, we have been learning about the celebration of Children's Day. Each student in the school made a mini origami sumo hat, which was then used for the scales of a fish. The fish is a symbol of Children's Day in Japan.

Kodomo no Hi (Children's Day) is a Japanese national holiday created to celebrate the country's children and to wish for their happiness, health and good fortune. It is held every year on May 5th.

Originally, Children's Day was called Tango no Sekku, or Boy's Day. For households with young boys, it is tradition to decorate homes with samurai armor (yoroi) and helmet (kabuto) miniatures, which represent the family's wish to raise strong and powerful boys.

Please note Sibling Photo orders must be placed BEFORE your last photo day.










