
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From the Principal's Desk

Phonics Screening Check - Year 1 Students

Phonics is the relationship between letters and sounds. It is vital in learning to read. The phonics screening check (PSC) is administered annually to Year 1 students by their classroom teacher. It is organised into 2 sections with a mixture of 40 real words and pseudo-words (made-up words). Our students will undertake this assessment in Week 6 of this term. The information provided by this assessment is used by classroom teachers to plan for the next steps of phonic and reading instruction for individual, small group and whole class settings.

NYP Basketball






