


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From the Principal's Desk

Good 360 Australia

Every year in Australia, \$2.5 billion of unsold household goods are wasted and 1 in 8 Australians are living below the poverty line. The result is a Circle of Good that reduces need and waste in our communities at the same

time so everyone benefits – from people to the planet. From our partnership with Good360 Australia, we were recently able to leverage an offer to obtain books donated from Booktopia at no cost to our school. We took up this offer because we have such a strong focus on reading and strongly promote reading at home. After all, "children are made readers on the laps of their parents".

We would love to see as many books as possible on the bookshelves of our families in our community. At the same time, we realise the financial constraints felt by so many at the moment. So, to support this, we are using our Book



Bungalow Sharing Library to make these wonderful books available to everyone in our community. These books are brand new and suit a range of ages. We encourage school

community members to browse the library and take a book to keep and cherish. The Sharing Library is located on the corner of North West terrace and First street. We will also use the Sharing Library to giveaway discontinued school Library books (when culling is needed to fit in all of our wonderful new books). Discontinued school Library books with have a big cross through the barcode. Any Library books with a normal barcode are in the Sharing Library by mistake and need to be returned.



Parenting Seminars




Then we revisited the story and talked about what changes in the goats as they get bigger (horn size, physical size, beard size) then children represented the different size goats by through mark Making.




