




World Teachers' Day – 27th of October

the students and staff have been busily creating some thoughtful gifts and experiences for our



























Good 360 - Christmas Gifts

We know that Christmas can place a great deal of stress on families. We hope that this venture will help to lighten this load for families and help to spread some kindness and joy. Walk for Kids' Mental Health

This November, we are getting active and fundraising for the 1 in 7 primary school-aged Aussie kids currently experiencing a mental illness (this statistic actually worsens as the age of the child increases with 1 in 4 adolescents affected by a mental health condition).



Our school is taking on the "Walk for Kids' Mental Health" challenge because we believe that every young mind should have the opportunity to be mentally fit and thrive. We're walking at least 21 minutes a day in November to boost our physical and mental wellbeing; whilst also fundraising to give young people, educators & parents access to evidence-based programs.

And as an extra incentive, for every \$100 we raise, I will walk 1km on my commute to school on the final day of the challenge. The Student Leaders will also be organising a special themed day for the final day of the challenge to celebrate all of our efforts! 


